Preface

The editors of the Journal of Chinese Law are proud to present the second issue of a two-issue symposium on legal developments concerning Taiwan. Like the first issue, the contents of this issue fall into four categories: the first category relates to legal aspects of Taiwan's international status and its foreign policy; the second concerns reforms in the domestic public law of Taiwan with particular attention accorded to constitutional law and judicial reform; the third focuses on laws relating to domestic financial and economic activities; and the fourth concerns legal issues, principles and regulations arising out of the growing relationships between Taiwan and the Mainland. Legal scholars and prominent lawyers from Taiwan, the People's Republic of China, Hong Kong and the United States have contributed articles and comments to this two-issue symposium.
