


OJS tutorial - Embedding Creative Commons License info

1. Embedding License information in article previews

[DOAJ eligibility requirements include the display of license information in the articles' preview page. Here are some instructions on how to enable the license display on OJS. Examples are taken from our partner journals *Waxing Moon* and *Law&Arts*]

STEP 1. Once you log on OJS, click on **Submissions** from the left menu bar and open the **Archives** tab.

STEP 2. Search and select the article whose license is missing, the one by Meyers in this instance. Once you click on the article title, it'll redirect you to the article record data.

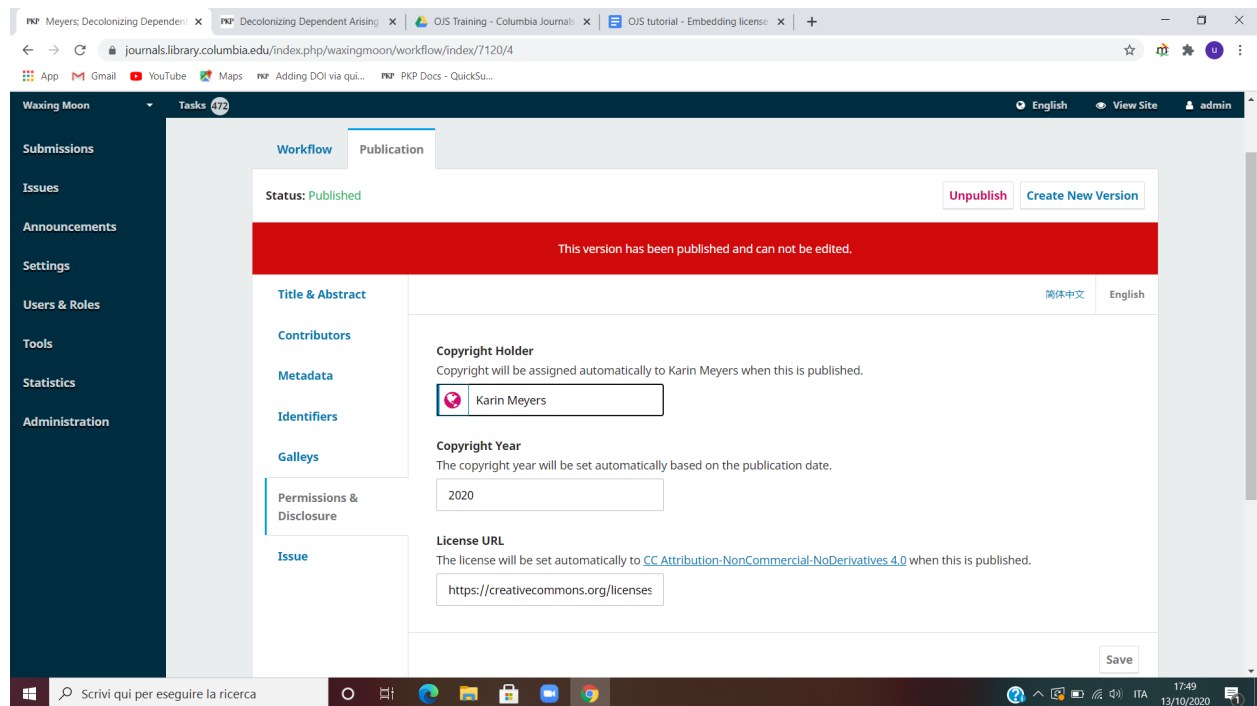
STEP 3. On the **Publication** tab, click on the menu item **Permissions and Disclosure**.

STEP 4. On this page you need to make sure that all three fields are completed as in the example below. Remember that for all CC licenses, the copyright holder is always the **author** of

the article, not the journal. You can find the URL for the appropriate CC license URL on the [Creative Commons website](https://creativecommons.org/licenses/).

If the article has been already published, you will have to **Unpublish** it, enter the data, **Save**, and then click on **Schedule for Publication**, which will republish the article exactly where it was.



Now OJS will update the information in the article preview page, embedding the CC license logo with redirect to the license page.

Depending on your website's design template, it might appear in a box in the right column, like this:

separate and apart from its capacity as the new owner of Time Warner's "must-see" CNN and HBO content. The courts concluded that AT&T, having largely abandoned its leverage over access to the Time Warner video content, lacked the ability to trigger blackouts. The courts emphasized the long-term carriage agreements Time Warner had previously negotiated with unaffiliated MVPDs and AT&T's offer to maintain content access during arbitration of disputes occurring for seven years after merger approval. The courts failed to recognize the significant harm AT&T, in its capacity as a major national MVPD, could inflict on competition and consumers by increasing its use of blackouts for negotiating leverage.
